

INFO FOR MOTORCYCLISTS

1. General Information

Pride March 2009 will be held on Saturday 14th November, starting at 6.30pm. Assembly is from 5.30pm.

The starting point will be Rundle Park, with the March proceeding down North Terrace, Kintore Avenue, Victoria Drive and on to Adelaide University, where the opening night party of Feast 2009 will be held.

The aim of the March is to celebrate the pride, courage, solidarity and diversity in our GLBTIQ communities.

Participation in the March is open to all who wish to express their support in our communities.

Only motorcyclists, passengers and motorcycles that are registered with Pride March Adelaide will be allowed to be in the motorcycle contingent at the head of the march.

A registration form is enclosed. Please return it to Pride March Adelaide by Friday 5th October.

If you know of any other motorcyclists who may wish to participate, please direct them to the web site www.prideadelaide.org where they can download this information as well as a registration form.

Motorcycles must be registered and roadworthy.

Motorcyclists must have a current licence and third-party insurance.

Motorcyclists may have a pillion passenger.

Permission has been granted by SA Police for motorcyclists and passengers not to wear helmets in the March.

2. Instructions

Assembly Area:

All registered participants in the motorcycle contingent will be informed of further details about the assembly area in October. The motorcycle contingent will follow the lead police vehicle and be in front of the lead walking entry.

On The March:

All vehicles in the March, including motorcycles, must not travel faster than walking pace of 5kph.

Motorcyclists must comply with the law, including traffic laws and directions of law enforcement officers.

Motorcyclists must respond to directives of marshals and authorities at all times. You may be asked to speed up pace, slowdown, stop or pull over due to an emergency situation, for safety reasons or to close gaps in the March.

Do not turn off your motorcycle if the March halts.

Do not ride under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

End Of March:

The March will end at the Feast 2009 Opening Night Party at Adelaide University. Further details about the end of the March will be sent out in October.

3. Prohibitions

The following are prohibited within the march start area and on the march route:

Fire

Fire, open flames, fireworks, flares, fire batons, fire breathing, sparklers, flammable goods and goods prohibited by law.

Animals

Dogs on leads allowed with walking entries.

Projectiles

Nothing is to be thrown at people watching the March. Materials such as condoms, leaflets, etc may be HANDED to people.

Loose Glitter

Dangerous when thrown, lethal when washed into our waterways.

Racism, Sexism & Homophobia

Banned: racist, sexist or homophobic messages or materials, on banners, signs, placards, clothing, leaflets, balloons, etc.

Full Frontal Nudity

You don't want to be arrested!

Sale of Merchandise

No selling of merchandise in Victoria Square prior to the March or on route. By arrangement with the Feast Office, merchandise may be sold at the end of the March at the Feast Opening Night Party.
